**The Korean Peninsula and Japan-US-ROK Cooperation**

Amidst all the uncertainty surrounding developments on the Korean Peninsula, it is increasingly clear that the state of Japan-US-ROK relations will be a critical factor in efforts to dismantle North Korea's nuclear program and eliminating the threat that it poses. For 15 years, officials and experts from the three countries have met in an off the record setting to discuss and compare views of Korean Peninsula developments and the status of the US extended deterrence. At the last meeting, held in August, they explored the prospects for negotiations to dismantle the North's nuclear program if all goes well — and if those talks collapse.

CRS is delighted to host a panel discussion featuring RAdm (r) Robert Girrier, President of Pacific Forum (which hosts the discussions), and Akira Igata, a CRS Visiting Professor who is an expert in Asia-Pacific strategic issues and has attended these meetings for several years. The discussion will be moderated by Brad Glosserman, Deputy Director of CRS, and who has run the trilateral meeting since its inception.
